

Moving venue from year to year, we at the Celtic Media Festival are lucky enough to have a wealth of stories on which to base our design. The girl that you'll see on your brochure and t-shirt comes from one of these tales: the story of how St Ives was founded.

In the 5th Century, a young Irish noblewoman, St Ia, stood on the Irish shoreline. Her sisters had departed for Cornwall and left her behind, feeling that she was too young for the arduous sea voyage. Ia was distraught, and in her grief, she began to pray. Noticing a little leaf floating in the waves, she touched it with her staff. Instead of sinking, though, the leaf grew and grew. Ia, realising that this was a sign from God, stepped onto the leaf, and sailed it like a raft across the Celtic Sea to Cornwall. Her arrival led to the founding of the beautiful town of St Ives.


